



## **Taste Sensation Charities announced**

Three Trafford charities will be at this year's Taste Sensation event at Altrincham Market on Sunday 26 September.

The Mayor's charities, Pictor Special School and Trafford Healthcare Urology Unit will both be on hand to offer information about their causes and Stockdale's will also be present.

Pictor special school in Timperley opened in 2003, pupils work in small class groups with high level specialist staff and each pupil has an individual programme tailored to their needs.

The urology unit sees patients with differing urological problems and runs various nurse and/or doctor led clinics throughout the week. They assess and treat problems which include kidney stones, prostate biopsies and hormone treatment for prostate cancers.

Stockdale's is a local registered charity that supports children & adults with learning and complex health needs, They will be offering children/ young people the chance to decorate cakes and biscuits free of charge.

Staff and pupils from Pictor School will also be coordinating a free children's activity and qualified staff from the Urology unit will be at an information stand to give advice on testing and urology cancers.

Visitors can make donations to the charities on the day or alternatively those who buy the Taste Sensation currency, the Teseta, can donate any unspent Tesetas to the charities by visiting their stalls.

Alongside the charities, other community projects participating in Taste Sensation '10 are; Trafford Allotments, who will be offering samples of locally grown produce, Fairtrade Trafford will be offering free tasters of fairly traded food and drink products, as well as providing information about Fairtrade and Altrincham and Bowdon Civic Society will be opening Altrincham Town Hall offering all those with an interest in local history the opportunity to appreciate the refurbishment of the Town Hall, refreshments will be available. Civic Society members will be on hand to answer questions and note your views and offer Town Hall tours from 1330-1530.
