REGULATIONS FOR ALTRINCHAM MARKET

1. Throughout these Regulations, the term "the Council" means the Trafford Borough Council.
2. These Regulations will apply to all stallholders and the Council reserves the right to terminate a licence without notice on any breach of the Regulations.
3. The market will open on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday for the sale of general retail goods and Thursday for the sale of Antiques and Bric-a-brac. When there is a public holiday or any day on which a market cannot lawfully be held an alternative day may be arranged.
4. Stallholders must pay the fee for the stall or stalls each market day to the Market Superintendent and obtain an official receipt.
5. Stall-holders must have their stall set up and vehicles off the market place by 9.30 a.m.
6. Allocation of stalls
 - The Council will not intentionally allow the stall of a regular trader who is absent on a particular market day to be used by a casual trader selling the same line.
 - Whenever practical the Council will ensure that traders selling the same line on the same row will be separated by four stalls or more.
 - Regular traders will be given preference over casual traders for any vacant stall that may be available on any market day.
 - Casual traders may be moved to a different stall if this is in the interests of the good management of the market.
 - Regular traders will only be moved in exceptional circumstances.
 - aQA M A casual trader may become a regular trader by attending the market for three months.
 - No trader will be offered two end stalls on a permanent basis



7. No explosive materials, fireworks, acids or any substance which might be a source of danger to the public will be allowed for storage, exhibition or sale on the market premises.
8. All stalls must be closed at 16.30 hours and cleared not later than 18.00 hours each market day.
9. No vehicle will be on the market area between 9.30 hours and 16.00 hours without the consent of the Markets Superintendent.
10. Stallholders must not damage or deface any stall or other property of the Council.
11. Stall-holders must not allow their stalls in whole or in part to be transferred or dispose of their licence to another Trader
12. Stall-holders may not alter or add to the structure electric wiring or fittings of the stalls without the consent of the Market Superintendent.
13. Stallholders may not use any heating apparatus, except with the prior consent of the Market Superintendent.
14. No stallholder may make a material change in the sale of goods stated on the application form without the prior consent of the Market Superintendent.
15. Stallholders and their assistants are to conduct themselves in an orderly manner and are not to commit any act that is liable to cause a disturbance or inconvenience to other stallholders.
16. Stallholders are required to keep their stall and surrounding area clean and free from litter.
17. Pitching, mock-auction, demonstrating and hand selling are prohibited.
18. Stall-holders selling food or drink are expected to be aware of relevant food hygiene regulations and to comply with them
19. Stallholders and other traders are required to accept full responsibility for the protection of their goods, vehicles and other possessions. The Council will not accept any liability for injury to persons or damage to vehicles or property arising from the operation of the market or the movement of stallholders' vehicles on the market area.
