


# Walton Road Active Neighbourhood

## Strategic Context



## What the GM Active Neighbourhoods programme is looking to achieve and by when

- The Active Neighbourhoods programme aims to support the development of Active Neighbourhoods across the GM districts
- The funding is available through the Mayors Challenge Fund (MCF)
- Funding is available to support interventions such as modal filters, which aim to reduce the impact of through traffic and speeding traffic in neighbourhoods.
  Funding may also be available for interventions to improve the public realm and other interventions such as crossings, identified by the community
- The development of the scheme will follow a community engagement and codesign approach.
- The programme will also support the districts in implementing these schemes on a temporary basis ('trial') at first, before they are made permanent.

The funding available for the scheme should be committed by March 2023, which can include the commencement of a trial






- The Walton Road area was proposed for entry to the programme through discussions between Trafford Council and TfGM
- The area was selected due to historic issues in the area with 'rat running' on Walton Road and surrounding streets
- Other reasons for choosing the area included
  - Opportunity to enhance access to Walton Park
  - Speeding vehicles on Langdale Road and Walton Road
  - Opportunity to improve access to local services

A 'four stage' engagement approach with the community was followed which commenced in February 2021. This included four public workshops and two mailouts to all addresses in the study area.

The most recent activity included a mailout, survey and engagement event in Feb/March 2022, where draft proposals were shared with the community.

## Next Steps



A summary report of the resident feedback on the draft scheme and recommended amendments to the plan has been shared with Trafford Council to consider

The very high response rate to the draft design survey and workshop provides a good basis on which to amend the proposals in line with resident feedback

At this stage the Arup/Sustrans project team commission with TfGM will end and the scheme can be taken forward by Trafford with support from TfGM

Alongside a summary of all engagement work to date and concept design input, a draft Full Business Case will also be produced by Arup for use by Trafford
