

Carriage of Assistance Dogs Exemption Application Form

Sections 169 &170 Equality Act 2010

Obligations on licensed drivers to carry assistance dogs

The Equality Act 2010 places duties on both licensed Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Drivers to carry guide, hearing and other assistance dogs accompanying disabled people, and to do so without charge.

However, to enable drivers with certain medical conditions that are aggravated by exposure to dogs, to drive, or continue to drive Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles, the Act includes provisions for drivers to be exempted from these requirements on medical grounds.

The Licensing Authority is responsible for issuing exemption certificates and must be satisfied that it is appropriate to do so on medical grounds.

Part 2 of this form must be completed by an appropriate specialist medical practitioner and must be accompanied by sufficient evidence of any allergy e.g. allergen test results, clinical history etc. A simple statement from a medical professional will not be considered as sufficient for the purpose of the exemption request.

If a driver has a chronic phobia to dogs, this form must be accompanied supported by a report from a psychiatrist or clinical psychologist.
