Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 23rd. inst. together with plan shewing the utilisation of the large Skating Rink as a Menagerie, etc. I understand this use will be of a more or less temporary nature, and that you will take full responsibility for the structure and its management, having full regard to the safety and the health of the public.

Satisfactory provision for cleansing the cages and removal of the refuse must be made to the requirements of the Council's Sanitary Department.

I understood when you called here last week that you would furnish an undertaking to be responsible for the structural and sanitary condition of the various exhibits and buildings in the White City establishment, taken over from Mr. Calvin Brown, and I shall be obliged if you will please let me have this.

The buildings although of a temporary character have now been up several years, and their condition should have careful attention especially those contrivances carrying numbers of the public in vehicles of various descriptions.


