

Please provide your comments below and explain your reason for supporting opposing or commenting on this specific part of the document Please include suggestions as to how you think we can improve the document:	<p>As a resident of The Mount I am very aware of the issue relating to "a number of examples of mid-20th -21st century developments ... which are intrusive and do not adequately reflect the special interest of the area". This particularly applies to the blocks of apartments in Townfield Gardens which have recently removed several large mature trees which previously screened them from view. One of these was removed for safety reasons and was pushing over a wall, however, the others were not. I would have thought there might have been a covenant regarding trees, attached to the apartments' original planning permission? The wall between Townfield Gardens and my property is now being rebuilt, but probably 3 feet lower than previously (I have numerous photographs). In addition, a number of years ago, the apartments management committee unilaterally removed an old brick wall which faced/screened the garages from view - this has been left unfinished with a few layers of brick above ground. I was told by the chair of the committee that "it is no concern to us what it looks like from your side, only what it looks like from our side". All this has radically altered the appearance of the top end of The Mount. I would be very disinclined to support the extension of the conservation area if it impinged on my ability to attempt to re-screen the Townfield Gardens apartments. I would be delighted to have an opportunity to discuss the recent developments 'on site'.</p>
