Sustainability Summary

There are a number of significant sustainability benefits associated with Policy W1 Economy. The key ones relate to enhancing Trafford's high economic performance; improving Trafford's image as a business destination; encouraging the long-term sustainability of the Borough's Town Centres; improving local neighbourhood quality; and protecting and enhancing townscape character. In addition, by seeking to focus economic activity on a number of key locations that are well related to areas of deprivation, the policy will have a positive impact on poverty, social exclusion and economic disparities. Policy W1 could also have a positive effect on the skills of the resident population. However, in order to increase the certainty of this impact, reference should be made to the use of legal agreements to secure employment opportunities for local residents.

The policy places an emphasis on ensuring that new employment development is located where it will be accessible by a range of alternative modes other than the private car. Another key objective of the policy is to improve public transport infrastructure in Trafford Park and direct B1 uses to the Regional Centre and Trafford's town centres. Policy W1 should therefore have a positive impact on reducing the effect of traffic on the environment; reducing contributions to climate change; improving air quality and improving the environmental performance of the economy.

A number of the proposed locations for economic development are adjacent to the Manchester Ship Canal and/or Bridgewater Canal. Consequently, until the Level 2/Hybrid SFRA has been completed there is some uncertainty over whether these sites are at risk of flooding. The extent to which this policy is compatable with the objective of reducing the impact of climate change is therefore unclear at present. In addition, due to the amounts of development that would be directed to canalside areas there is some uncertainty over the impact the proposals would have on water quality. However, Policy L5 should ensure new developments incorporate SUDs where appropriate to reduce surface water runoff into watercourses and reduce the risk of flooding from sewers.
