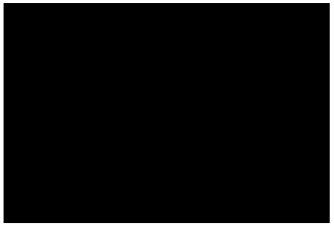

RE:- TRAFFORD CORE STRATEGY EXAMINATION INSPECTOR'S NOTE 5 BUDGET 2011 – PLANNING FOR GROWTH POLICY R4 – GREEN BELT OPPOSITION TO THE PROPOSED CHANGES MADE TO THE DESIGNATION OF LAND AT DAVENPORT GREEN IN LIGHT OF THE GOVERNMENT'S BUDGET STATEMENT "PLAN FOR GROWTH" AND THE PROPOSED ENTERPRISE ZONE AT MANCHESTER AIRPORT

Davenport Green should be returned to Green Belt status to prevent development.

To destroy this beautiful countryside with any development would be a catastrophe for people living nearby. Flora and fauna would suffer. Wythenshawe Hospital's lung centre would be blighted with air pollutants. They now have to cope with many people from this area (Wythenshawe) that are affected by lung diseases caused by filthy air. The trees and plants growing on the development site are our only hope of some clean air in our lungs.

There are many office buildings not occupied in the area, and a large number of workplaces on local industrial estates that could, if occupied, give many people the chance of work. There is still land with easy access that is suitable for building in the Greater Manchester area that could cope with full employment, without spoiling our beautiful countryside.

The wild area next to Newall Green (Davenport Green) must be one of the few sites in the county with such wild beauty.

Building destroys our open spaces and does not improve our land.

The area between Newall Green and Roaring Gate Lane should now be classified as an ecological and wildlife site of importance and given the protection of being a Green Belt site that it needs.
