Council tax bills have arrived and as with normal protocol the Parish Council use this medium to explain about the precept charges. A Parish Council can raise a local tax (the precept) which is collected via the Council Tax and paid to us by Trafford Council. The precept is paid by every household and varies in accordance to your property band in the same way as the Council Tax.

At the Parish Council meeting of 10 December 2025, the Parish Council **resolved** to increase the 2026–27 Parish Precept by 5%, as approved under Agenda Item 11.2.1 (Minute Reference P1270). Trafford Borough Council were informed of this decision.

The Council fully recognises that many residents are facing financial pressures and that times remain challenging. However, the decision to increase the precept was not taken lightly. Rising costs, including service provision, utilities, maintenance and community support, have made an increase unavoidable in order to maintain essential local services.

The Parish Council will continue to manage its finances responsibly and will endeavour to carry on the important work undertaken across the parish, ensuring value for money while supporting and improving our local community.

The precept bandings for 2026-2027 are as follows:

Band A	45.53
Band B	53.12
Band C	60.71
Band D	68.30
Band E	83.48
Band F	98.66
Band G	113.83
Band H	136.60

The Parish Community Improvement Operatives team will continue to maintain a visible presence within the community carrying out improvements where required. This service operates as a **top-up** provision alongside Trafford Borough Council, Amey/One Trafford, L&Q Group, Your Housing Group, the M31 Project and Ward Councillors.

The Environmental Committee have designed a budget that will be allocated specifically to community areas and forthcoming local events, supporting activities that benefit residents and enhance parish life. Fly-tipping is the illegal dumping of waste on land that is not licensed to accept it. This may include household waste, large items such as mattresses or fridges, garden waste or commercial waste. Fly-tipping is a criminal offence and may result in a fine or imprisonment. All incidents will be reported to Trafford Borough Council Environmental Improvement Officers, who actively investigate and pursue enforcement action.

Residents and homeowners are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that any waste carrier they appoint to remove their rubbish is appropriately licensed.
