

License conditions

1. The license is granted based on the information provided in the submitted application.
2. If it has been declared (in the application form) that the entire proceeds from organising the market or car boot sale are to be used solely for charitable, social, sporting, or political purposes then the council reserve the right to ask for evidence of this.
3. The number of pitches/traders/spaces at the event must not exceed the number agreed by the Council, as evidenced in the license.
4. If the license is for a charitable car boot sale, pitches or spaces must not be given to commercial traders and no vans exceeding 10cwt carrying capacity or commercial vehicles are permitted.
5. If the license for a charitable car boot sale, each and every trader at such an approved event shall sell or display only articles surplus to their own domestic requirements usually described as jumble or bric-a-brac including books, records, small second-hand domestic furniture, and equipment, etc. **Traders selling new items and goods bought in for re-sale including any of the above similar items shall not be permitted.**
6. The site of the event, all roads and approaches must be left in a clean and tidy condition and free from litter immediately after the close of the sale.
7. The organiser shall not cause or permit notices or posters advertising of the event to be displayed on lampposts, buildings etc., without the permission of the owners of these premises or in contravention of the Planning, Highway and other specific Legislation and Local Byelaws.
8. Adequate provisions must be made for the safe entry and exit of vehicles.
9. The organiser shall not cause or permit any noise or nuisance to the residents in the neighbourhood of the event.
10. The Council reserves the right to undertake inspection of all approved events to ensure compliance with all written consent given and compliance with these conditions.
