Adoption Statement - 25th January 2012

In accordance with Regulations 24 (2) and 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004 (as amended), notice is hereby given that Trafford Council adopted the Trafford Core Strategy on 25th January 2012. The Core Strategy sets out the broad framework for the spatial development of Trafford up to 2026. All other Development Plan Documents which the Council will produce will be in conformity with the Core Strategy.

The Core Strategy DPD was subject to examination by an independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government. The examination included hearing sessions in February, March, May and September 2011. The Inspectors' Report was received on 28th November 2011 and can be viewed as set out below.

Any person aggrieved by the Trafford Core Strategy may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made within six weeks from 25th January 2012.

Availability of documents

The Core Strategy, the Inspector's Report, Sustainability Appraisal Report, the Sustainability Appraisal Adoption Statement and this Adoption Statement are available for public inspection at all public libraries/Access Trafford offices in Trafford, during normal opening hours.
